## Artificial pitches (2020-2021)

### Rules on use of artificial pitches

According to FA rules, artificial pitches can be used for OYFL matches but only if they meet the regulations set by the FA/FIFA. In the League rules, under rule 20 (A) the relevant paragraph is:

“Football Turf Pitches (3G) are allowed in this Competition provided they meet the required performance standards and are listed on the FA’s Register of Football Turf Pitches. All Football Turf Pitches used must be tested (by a FIFA accredited test institute) every three years and the results passed to The FA. The FA will give a decision on the suitability for use and add the pitch to the Register.”

**NOTE:**  
If an artificial pitch is not listed on the FA's register, then it cannot be used for matches in the League.  
SCORY/SCOR 20.(A).

## Artificial pitches (2020-2021)

### Footwear

The default surface for pitches used by teams in the OYFL is grass and players will have appropriate footwear for that. Teams using an artificial turf pitch for any home games should inform the opposition that it is an artificial surface, including the type of surface, and the type of footwear, e.g. football boots, that should be worn when sending out their fixture confirmation to the visiting team.

**Oxford City FC** have a standing instruction that all players, managers and coaches and match officials should wear standard football boots when on the 3G surface, on both their main stadium pitch and their training pitch and that parents should stay off the 3G surface.
